Your cost in 2021 will be \$8.00 for paper maps (\$1.00 more than last year) and \$3.00 for CDs (same as last year). Due to a shortfall last year, we won't be offering the early bird special this year. But the deadline for ordering maps is still Jan 31. Checks payable to either me or 100 Club or cash are acceptable. Paper maps go out for printing Feb 1, so orders for paper maps will NOT be accepted after Jan 31, no exceptions. ### BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE...MORE PLASTIC, THAT IS

Despite COVID-19...or perhaps because of it...it's been a phenomenal year for our hikers, who amassed almost 13,000 total miles among 75 hikers, including 11 first-timers. Forty-five hikers will receive annual mileage pins at our Oct 29 hikers' banquet; 10 of those also achieved

major milestones, including six first-timers and one 5000-miler (only the 3rd ever awarded). Another noteworthy accomplishment among our hikers was that 6 earned 400-mile pins this year, and one earned a 500-mile pin...another first. To put it into context, in the previous 29 years of the club (1991-2019) a total of only six 400-mile pins had been awarded.
